"Since around 1991 the digital library field has emerged, so now there are thousands of papers in the field, and thousands of digital librarians. However, we face many challenges in making our systems interoperable, and in helping our users develop a clear model of what services they provide. While there are online resources to help people keep up with all this, i.e., to support teaching and learning about digital libraries (e.g., http://en.wikiversity. org/wiki/Curriculum on Digital Libraries), it is helpful to attend focused events like the DL.org Autumn School to gain a perspective on the field and to find answers to important questions."



Autumn School Focus

The DL.org Autumn School focuses on modelling issues, practical solutions and best practices on interoperability. Participants will come away with a deeper understanding of digital libraries and digital repositories along the perspectives of content, functionality, users, policy, quality and architecture, the six core domains captured in the Digital Library Manifesto, which stems from the DELOS Reference Model. The Autumn School also delivers valuable insights into how to address interoperability challenges. Internationally established lecturers lead each of the half-day sessions and most of them will be on-site throughout the week for further discussion.

Target Audiences

This premier training and education event is designed for librarians and librarian decision-makers, information scientists, computer scientists, PhD students, early career researchers and young professionals working in the Digital Library (DL) and Digital Repository (DR) arena. The Autumn School offers participants an important opportunity to network and share experiences with peers, practitioners and international experts across disciplinary and national boundaries.

Programme

This one-week intensive school comprises nine half-day sessions. Established lecturers each lead a session and most of them are on-site throughout the week for further discussion. At the end of the week the learning experience will be reinforced by the report of a testimonial for each group across the six domains and the presentations on digital libraries and digital repositories as well as interoperability challenges.
